CERTIFICATION BULLETIN 2017-05

Certification Requirement Changes Status Letter - Action Not Required for CAN/ULC-60839-11-1

To: Subscribers to UL's and ULC's Certification Services under
CAN/ULC S319, Electronic Access Control Systems (ALVY7)
CSA-C22.2 Part No. 205, Signal Equipment (UEHX7)
UL 294, Access Control System Units (ALVY)
Members of the ULC Advisory Committee and Other Interested Parties

On February 1, 2016 CAN/ULC 60839-11-1 Standard for Alarm and Electronic Security Systems: Electronic Access Control Systems was published, replacing CAN/ULC S319 as the Canadian national Standard for Access Control systems and devices.

UL and ULC will be using the Certification Requirement Changes process when evaluating to the new requirements of CAN/ULC 60839-11-1.

As part of the Action Not Required approach, the decision was made that "No Action" is required for products that are currently certified to CAN/ULC S319 and CSA- C22.2 Part No. 205 (for those products that are currently certified to a combination of UL 294 and CSA-C22.2 No 205).

Please refer to the following for specific details:

- September 30, 2020 is the effective date. New and revised products submitted for certification on and after the effective date will be required to be investigated to CAN/ULC 60839-11-1. All new and revised products that would have been previously certified to CAN/ULC S319, and access control products evaluated to CSA-C22.2 No 205 will then be investigated to CAN/ULC 60839-11-1.
- Existing certifications of these products will be allowed to continue to be certified after September 30, 2020 and not be withdrawn provided there are no changes to the physical equipment design or function or until a new/revised requirement in Standard CAN/ULC 60839-11-1 is determined as "Action Required" to require a review in the future. For example, if there are changes to the physical equipment design or function after the effective date, the product (in its entirety) will need to be evaluated to CAN/ULC 60839-11-1.

This approach enables manufacturers to transition to new requirements based on their own schedule and their market demands. It will also allow manufacturers to continue producing equipment presently certified provided there are no changes made to the products or there are no modifications where compliance must be confirmed.
